## **Fund Classification and Fund Type Definition**

## **GOVERNMENTAL FUND TYPES**

<u>General Fund:</u> The general fund accounts for and reports all financial resources not accounted for and reported in another fund. The general fund balance is available to the school district for any purpose provided it is disbursed or transferred in accordance with Ohio law.

<u>Special Revenue Funds:</u> Special revenue funds are used to account for and report the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are restricted or committed to expenditure for specified purposes other than debt service or capital projects.

<u>Debt Service Fund:</u> Debt service funds are used to account for and report financial resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned to expenditure for principal and interest.

<u>Capital Projects Funds:</u> Capital projects funds are used to account for and report financial resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned to expenditure for capital outlays, including the acquisition or construction of capital facilities and other capital assets.

## **PROPRIETARY FUND TYPES**

<u>Enterprise Funds:</u> Enterprise funds account for any activity for which a fee is charged to external users for goods or services.

## **FIDUCIARY FUND TYPES**

Fiduciary funds account for assets held by the School District in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, or other governmental units. The fiduciary fund category is split into four classifications: pension trusts funds, investment trust funds, private-purpose trust funds and agency funds.

<u>Private-Purpose Trust Funds:</u> To report all other trust arrangements under which the principal and income benefit individuals, private organizations, or other governments. These trust funds do not support the school district's own programs.

<u>Agency Funds:</u> To report resources held by the reporting government in a purely custodial capacity (assets equal liabilities).
