Looks can be deceiving. That's the message behind the unique
traveling exhibit called "Hidden in Plain Sight."

The Union County Multi-Agency Drug Enforcement (M.A.D.E.) Task
Force and the Union County Drug Free Coalition are promoting this
hands on educational exhibit for parents and adults to learn more
about signs of early substance abuse among teens.

The exhibit is a mock bedroom of a teenager. Amidst the clutter of
clothing, school supplies and personal care products are more than
50 items that can actually be signals that a young person could be
involved in dangerous and even illegal drug activity.

Adults have the opportunity to "snoop and search" the unique
display. Due to the nature of the materials presented, no youth are
permitted to attend.
